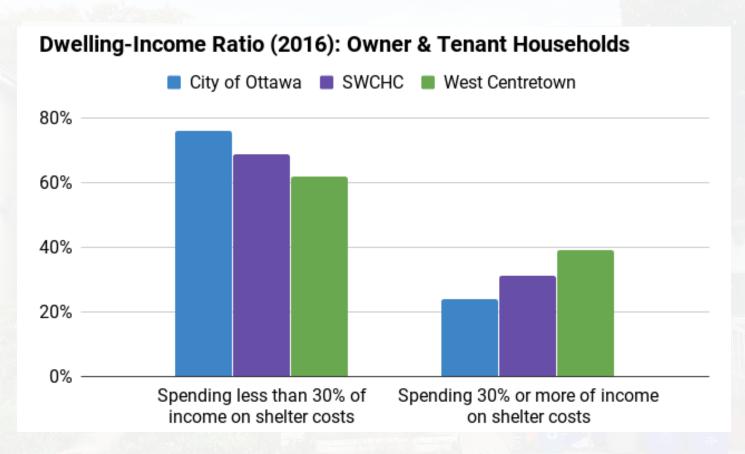
Percentage Change in Tenant Households Spending 30% or more of Income on Shelter Costs 2006-2016

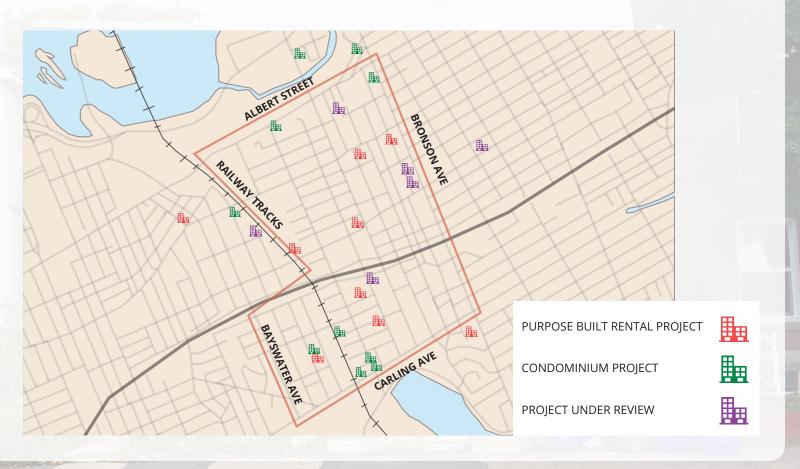
POPULATION HAS DECREASED WHILE TOTAL # OF PRIVATE DWELLINGS HAS INCREASED
